



Greetings Miata friends.







March 2022 More SMC fun.



MAZDA MX-5 / Miata

1989-1998

1.6L 5MT (116 HP) 1.8L (131 HP)


Sold over 400,000 units. Codename Roadster modeled after the British roadsters of the 60's and 70's. (especially the Lotus Elan) the car was simple, reliable, and nimble. It could be a daily driver, it was that much fun. Noted for it's famous Pop up headlights and cute design. For many this is the "Quintessential" MX-5 Miata. This stunning example was owned by Bob and Jeanette Benoit.



MAZDA MX-5 / Miata 2006-2015

1.8L 5MT (125HP) 2.0L 5MT, 6MT, 6AT (160 HP)
A major design overhaul from the NB, the NC was almost 2" longer and 75#'s heavier than the last version of the NB. Some consider the NC to be a chunkier yet far more refined version. Power Retractable Hardtop shown . Note the flared fenders, HID headlights and top center brake light. This lovely NC PRHT is owned by Dennis and Mary Manning.





1.6L 5MT (110HP) 1.8L (146 HP)


Dubbed the NB. Sold another 400,000 units! Very similar to the NA with the Pop up headlights gone due to pedestrian safety concerns. A little wider, larger antiroll bar, better brakes with optional ABS. Later years saw the Mazdaspeed (2004-2005). This lovely 2004 Mazdaspeed is owned by Mark and Pam Weinberg.



MAZDA MX-5 / Miata 2016-Present

1.5L Skyactiv-G (131HP), 2.0L Skyactiv-G (155HP) 2018 Skyactiv-G (181HP)

Another major Miata re-design, the ND is available as a Roadster (Soft Top) and RF (Retractable Fastback) This is a fully modern car with advanced safety features and styling. More compact to bring it in line with the original NA. As before, the ND is a blast to drive. This Sharp example is owned by Art Stromberg and Lynn Christensen.



In 2015 I felt I needed more fun activities and friends to enjoy them with. I was retired and had stopped doing many of the previous activities I had enjoyed with friends. Then I went to an Indy Car race with two friends in 2015 and saw the soon to be available 2016 Mazda MX-5 that was on display and I loved it. When I returned home I called my Mazda dealer and told the salesman to call me when the new MX-5s arrived. In August he called to tell me a truck was offloading the first of the new MX-5s. My wife Cathey and I immediately rushed down to the dealer and bought a blue one. Life hasn't been the same since. The Miata and everything associated with it has become a major hobby of mine.

When I first got the Miata it was a fun little car with great handling and acceleration that I loved to drive. I lived to find uncrowded twisty roads to power through the turns experiencing the speed, lateral G-forces, the wind in my hair, and the sun pouring in. But for greater thrills in 2016 I got involved with "Track Days" where you pay for the opportunity to drive your car on dedicated race tracks. I like to tell people that when I bought the MX-5 and joined the Club I got a couple of hundred new friends. Another good decision I made was joining the Miata Club board as VP And Events Coordinator in 2016. Now I was really involved and having fun. A few other fun and motivated people like Jeff and Hope Morris, and Tony Monro also joined the board who, along with the remaining existing board members starting working hard to grow the number of activities and promote the club. We were having a great time with the club and all the new members that were joining.

Since I joined the club I've participated in hundreds of events with hundreds of nice club members. We have traveled over every fun back road, visited just about every town, and seen all the interesting sites in Arizona, many of them several times. We've been to interesting places we would never have seen had we not joined the Miata Club. The hundreds of social events have taken us to many hotels and good restaurants all over the state and beyond.

I am truly grateful for all the great times I have had with the Miata and all the wonderful people I've met in the Sahuaro Miata Club. I'm looking forward to more good times with fun people in my MX-5.





My early history with cars:

From an early age I was a car nut. I read everything I could find, mostly interested in small foreign 2 seaters. Back then, there was no internet. So, everything came from magazines and books. My first two-seater was a Fiat 850 spider circa 1969. It was a fun, totally under powered little car with the quality that only Fiat and companies like Yugo and Renault could provide. It was a lot of fun but built like junk. Later I purchased my first real two seat sports car a 1965 Lotus Elan S2 SE. Gosh I loved that car, however, at 19 I just could not afford to keep it on the road. You see as much as the Lotus was a thrilling little roadster, it was a British wallet drainer. The Elan is considered by many to be the quintessential sports car. Does the Lotus look familiar? Through the years I drove many mundane cars and vans, but I always had a soft spot for my original little roadsters. Oh, by the way, in the mid-eighties, Hope and I did have a Mazda RX-7 Series 2 GS for a few years. It ran like a watch, however when our child Renee was born, we sold it for something that could hold a car seat. (Yes Dear)







Finding my Miata:

In the spring of 2016, I found a Lotus for sale in Tucson, it was located at a Copart salvage scrap yard. That should have been my first tip off. The add said "Lotus Elite, 1975, Like New", "You just need a feather duster" etc. etc. Scrap yards and feather dusters don't go together. So, my loving wife Hope escorted me down to Tucson and there we found a car that would have taken \$30,000 to restore. I was heartbroken.

Hope feeling sorry for me said, "Well, what else can you get?" I thought about it for a short while and the Miata came to mind. An "NA" Miata due to its resemblance to my Lotus Elan. We scoured the internet looking for a "Hard Top" Miata. You know, one of those newer Miata's with the Power Retractable Hard Top. And it couldn't have one of those silly smiley faces. It had to have a proper Miata grill. (I knew nothing about Miata's) So basically, I bought the first PRHT I could find without that silly face. Back in the spring of 2016 PRHT Miata's were not easy to find, plus I had to strike while the iron was hot.

My history with my 2008 NC PRHT Miata:

Where do I begin? I look back at my fuel logs and I see my first fill up was on June 21, 2016. My new to me Miata had 88,256 miles on it and with my 2.0-liter engine I was averaging 24.5 mpg. In hindsight, I should have waited and purchased one of those 25,000 mile, pristine, driven to church models everyone finds for \$4,500.00.



However, I tend to be impatient. So, from June of 2016 to November of 2016, I drove my little car with the original 2.0-liter engine. However, I wanted more. I wanted more Zoom-Zoom. Being a fast learner, I read everything I could on Miata's. NA's, NB's, NC's and the newly released ND. I wanted a super charger. A Cosworth super charger to be exact, sold by Good-Win Racing and Flyin Miata. Hope and I made a road trip to San Diego, in search of more Zoom-Zoom.

Did you know that it's not a good idea to supercharge a small Miata engine with 91,000 miles? Did you know the NC1 (The ones without the smiley face) did not have forged internals, they had cast internals)? Cast internals came with the NC2's. That's right, the ones with the smiley faces. Do you see a pattern here? My wife Hope does! So Good-Win suggested we install a new Mazda MZR 2.5-liter engine. It would be like the supercharged version with no miles on it and the extra torque and horsepower would negate the need for a supercharger. (If you believe that, then I have a lot in Florida I would like to sell you)

Mods to my 124,000-mile 2008 NC1: (Did you see the movie "Money Pit"?)

Car mods to a car nut are like bigger amplifiers and speakers to a Hi-Fi buff, more lenses to a photography geek, a Smith and Wesson revolver to a gun collector. You can never have enough. Here is a partial listing of everything I have done to my Miata. (Please don't show this to Hope Morris.)

2.5L Mazda MZR engine, Triple Pass Racing Radiator, Racing Clutch and Flywheel, Complete front to back stainless exhaust system including ceramic coated stainless headers. Upgraded brake pads and slotted and dimpled rotors, high performance anti-sway bars, coils, and Koni shocks, upgraded infotainment system, EcuTek interface and tune from MotoEast, front shock tower brace and Stainless coolant recovery tank not to mention Shayloni, my Hula girl dashboard goddess. This list is what comes to my 70-year-old not so sharp mind as I type this.



As you can see my engine compartment has been jazzed up a little bit. Cobalt shock tower brace stiffens the front end. The Moroso coolant expansion tank is stainless steel, this prevents leaks that can result in thermal destruction of modern engines. Hood props keep the hood up for easy access to the 2.5 liter engine.



My real feelings on the NC and where it sits amongst the other Miata generations


I found out after I purchased my NC that by many people, the NC is the dog of the group. The black sheep, the boat, the lumbering, slow, heavy as a brick pile of dung worst generation. You know, to long, to wide, to high, to heavy just a mess. Well, that was and is a load of misinformation. In my opinion the NC is a fantastic generation, a fantastic sports car, a fantastic Miata. Everything that has been said about this car was from angry people who NEVER drove an NC Miata. You see the Mazda NC Miata compared to the NB Miata is 2" longer, .4" higher and .4" wider. And the weight of the NC Miata was only 102#'s heavier. The horsepower of the NB was 146bhp to the NC's 170bhp. When you consider how many more safety features, reinforced structures, and modern accouterments the NC has over the first two generations I think Mazda did an amazing job. Another reason for the distain towards the NC was the e fact this was a 100% new car with non interchangeable parts from the previous generations. If a person purchased an NC they could not modify it with current off the shelf components. So, NA and NB owners were caught in a situation where they could not economically upgrade to an NC and use existing performance parts. This NC1 was scoffed at because it had the posture of a small SUV. You could fit a family of four in the space of the wheel wells. This was not the way it was supposed to be. Just before the NC was released the US Department of transportation changed bumper height regulations due to the influx of SUVs onto the American auto market. Mazda had to raise the height of the NC's bumpers to pass this regulation. Mazda increased the spring length of all four NC Miata springs to raise the car up to meet this requirement. It was a cheap and fast fix that IMHO bit them in the butt. In the NC2 generation (There is that smiley face again) they moved up the bumpers, redesigned the front and rear facias to accommodate these changes and placed correct length springs on the NC2's. Now the NC Miata's did



Today, many people look at the NC generation as one of the best generations. Some people feel it is the best generation. Reviewers who never drove an NC are now driving them for the first time. Every review I have read from these people both in print and on video say the same thing. This is not just a great sports car; this is a great Miata. The Miata NC is based on a shortened RX-8 chassis. It is much stiffer and a far better platform for racing. You can modify the suspension and brakes with serious aftermarket parts. The drop in 2.5I engine gives this car the extra torque and horsepower the car needs. You can pass cars on the freeway without saying "I think I can-I think I can". The car has real features on it that make driving a delight. And by the way, PRHT owners love the security of their 12 second open and close hardtops. I love mine which as noted earlier is why I bought the car in the first place. Of course when I bought my car it was really because of the hard top, I learned much more as time went on.

Like the previous generations, the transmission is a delight, period. I drive a 6 speed and it has a wonderful gearbox. Shifting is awesome and perfect for heal and tow driving. The stock brakes are amazing, I upgraded mine because I could. If you race your Miata's, Wilwood had complete big brake kits for heavy track use. For me, the biggest reason to get a NC is that it is more comfortable. I am overweight, if I lost 40 pounds, I could shave a few tenths off my 0-60. That said, I feel like a sardine in a NA or ND. Taller or stouter people will appreciate the extra cabin space you have in an NC. Understand, it's still a tiny car. The NC does feel roomier even though the dimensions are similar to previous generations.

Today, we see more and more NCs on the track winning more records. More people are realizing what a great platform the NC is. Even if you own a different generation Miata, you owe it to yourself and the greater Miata community in general to test drive the greatest generation. I'm not saying you will not find me with a 2023 or a 2024 Miata. What I am saying is that the NC is a great car.







