





It was early October and the summer temperatures had abated in "The Valley of The Sun" making it a perfect time to drop the convertible tops on our Miata's and go for a drive and lunch. 16 club members met in Cave Creek, AZ for a lazy 27-mile drive through the scenic hills of Cave Creek, Carefree, and down Lake Bartlett Road to Bartlett Lake Recreational Area. The roads were lightly traveled except for a few others out for a morning drive in the country, like the old British sports car club that waved as they passed going the other direction. The temperature was around 80 degrees and there was some cloud cover that protected us from the sun's rays making it a very comfortable drive. We were treated to panoramic views of the mountains and rolling hills, that were covered in green thanks to the greater than usual monsoon rains.

The group stopped at SB Cove at the lake for a short break to stretch our legs, view the lake, and admire each other's Miata's. Once refreshed the thought of a Big Earl's cheeseburger and fries became overwhelming so the caravan of Miata's headed back up the road to Big Earl's Greasy Eats in Cave Creek for lunch.

Known as the old Cave Creek gas station, Big Earl's Greasy Eats was designed as a station for Standard Oil in 1935. Today, the Cave Creek station, Big Earl's Greasy Eats, is the only known surviving example of a 1930s art deco Standard gas station in the greater Phoenix metropolis. The former station originally was located on 19th Avenue in Phoenix and was moved to Cave Creek in 1952. It functioned as a Standard station until the late 1980s when it was converted to a restaurant.

We found Big Earl's was quite busy, but everyone enjoyed chatting and getting to know one another better while we waited for the food. The food came out quickly and it disappeared even faster. After an enjoyable lunch together, everyone dropped the tops and made their own way home to various parts of the valley.





Some people have been commenting that **Meetup** sends them too many emails. There is a way for you to manage what content you wish **Meetup** to send to you.

Here's how to do it:

- To initiate the process, just click on your picture in the upper right hand corner of the screen (on a computer)
- 2. Then select "settings".
- 3. **U**nder "settings", you will see a selection on the left side bar "email updates". Clicking on the email updates will bring in a list of events that cause **Meetup** to send you an email.

- Uncheck any of the listed boxes and that will stop Meetup from emailing you for each of those particular events.
 - Specifically, in the middle, there is New Meetup Groups, by unchecking that box, you will no longer get emails announcing a new meetup group that may have something to do with your "interests", indicators you selected when you signed up for the application.
- 5. **O**nce you have made your changes, you can go back to your photo and click on it to return to the Sahuaro MX5 Miata Club.

MAZDA MX-5 / Miata

1989-1998

1.6L 5MT (116 HP) 1.8L (131 HP)

Sold over 400,000 units. Codename Roadster modeled after the British roadsters of the 60's and 70's. (especially the Lotus Elan) the car was simple, reliable, and nimble. It could be a daily driver, it was that much fun. Noted for it's famous Pop up headlights and cute design. For many this is the "Quintessential" MX-5 Miata. This stunning example was owned by Bob and Jeanette Benoit.



MAZDA MX-5 / Miata 2006-2015

1.8L 5MT (125HP) 2.0L 5MT, 6MT, 6AT (160 HP)
A major design overhaul from the NB, the NC was almost 2" longer and 75#'s heavier than the last version of the NB. Some consider the NC to be a chunkier yet far more refined version. Power Retractable Hardtop shown . Note the flared fenders, HID headlights and top center brake light. This lovely NC PRHT is owned by Dennis and Mary Manning.



MAZDA MX-5 / Miata 1998-2005

1.6L 5MT (110HP) 1.8L (146 HP)

Dubbed the NB. Sold another 400,000 units! Very similar to the NA with the Pop up headlights gone due to pedestrian safety concerns. A little wider, larger antiroll bar, better brakes with optional ABS. Later years saw the Mazdaspeed (2004-2005). This lovely 2004 Mazdaspeed is owned by Mark and Pam Weinberg.

2016-Present

1.5L Skyactiv-G (131HP), 2.0L Skyactiv-G (155HP) 2018 Skyactiv-G (181HP)

Another major Miata re-design, the ND is available as a Roadster (Soft Top) and RF (Retractable Fastback) This is a fully modern car with advanced safety features and styling. More compact to bring it in line with the original NA. As before, the ND is a blast to drive. This Sharp example is owned by Art Stromberg and Lynn Christensen.



The urge to jump in our Miata's, rev up the engine, dump the clutch, and aggressively run through the gears through some fast corners is strong in many Miata drivers. The roar of the exhaust note and the whine of the engine as it approaches the upper RPM limits are intoxicating to us. The adrenaline builds in us as the speed climbs and the G-forces increase. The rush of the speed and the excitement makes us feel alive and free. As we "floor" the pedal, there is a sudden spurt of adrenaline through our body, which has many effects: blood pressure rises instantly, heartbeat races, body temperature rises, and we can feel a slight tingling in our limbs.

Physiological studies of fast driving indicates that speed increases the challenge of driving, increasing the excitement, increasing the fun, where the driver experiences "flow" or the total emergence in a task.


A flow state, also known as being in the "zone", is the mental state in which a person performing some activity is fully immersed in a feeling of energized focus, full involvement, and enjoyment in the process of the activity. In essence, flow is characterized by the complete absorption in what one does, and a resulting transformation in one's sense of time.

Achieving this fun state of flow in our Miata's on public roads can be dangerous, illegal, and expensive. So, what's an adrenaline seeking Miata owner to do if they want to go fast, but doesn't want to be socially irresponsible? One alternative is participated in track days, or High-Performance Driver Education (HPDE) events, or all out racing. All out racing isn't realistic for many people due to the skills required, the commitment of time and money, and the high danger. But track days and HPDE events are available to just about anyone with the desire, a car, and a few dollars to blow.

A track day or HPDE event is an organized event in which non-members are allowed to drive around established motor racing circuits in road legal or track prepared cars without speed restriction. Although, the practice of actual racing is forbidden. Criteria for participation is usually holding a driving license, meeting a minimum age restriction, wearing an approved helmet, and having a safe vehicle to drive.

There are about 8 members of the Sahuaro Miata Club that regularly participate in these events at 5 local tracks in the Phoenix area, Inde Motorsport Ranch in Wilcox, Arizona, and at Chuckwalla Valley Raceway in Desert Center, California. Four organizations that run these events are ProAutoSports, National Auto Sports Association (NASA), Sports Car Club of America (SCCA), and the Porsche Club of America.

I encourage everyone that thinks they might be interested in giving these events a try to read up on these events and come out to a track day event to experience the excitement, talk to participants, and even go along for a ride with an experienced driver on one of their 20-minute track sessions. Several track day events are posted on our club Meetup page each year, and more are listed on the websites of the organizations previously mentioned above.
